On August 20, 2013, a gunman walked into an elementary school in suburban Atlanta armed with an AK-47.

But he didn't get far.

While 870 children waited in fear as their school rushed into lockdown mode and the nation faced yet another story of tragedy, one woman rewrote the ending.

But the story doesn't start when the shooter, Michael Hill, entered the school that day. It starts with Antoinette Tuff, a school clerk who faced her own pain, hurt, and rejection, yet held onto grace, faith, and hope as she talked him into surrendering. A hope that anchored her in the most high-stakes moments, a grace that allowed her to empathize with a hurting young man, and a faith that gave her the courage to love him back from the brink.


