Addressing the Natural Differences Among Learners

Educator Katie Novak explains how inclusive education really works in the classroom and at home to help parents become informed partners in improving education for all learners

Let Them Thrive by Katie Novak, Ed.D.

Until recently, schools used traditional models of education that were focused on teachers providing a "one-size-fits-all" curriculum to all students. It's how many of us were educated—seated in rows, sitting quietly listening to a lecture, and taking the same multiple-choice test.

Katie Novak, Ed.D., a mother of four with 15 years of experience in teaching and administration, is one of the key people working to shed this traditional model and introduce "personalized" education.

In her new book, Let Them Thrive: A Playbook for Helping Your Child Succeed in School and in Life, Novak reveals the most effective strategies for supporting all kids in becoming successful, lifelong learners. She introduces the research-based framework of Universal Design for Learning (UDL), and gives parents clear guidance for how best to work with their children and their children's teachers.

Novak encourages parents to be aware of their role in supporting schools, writing, "Our teachers are up against a lot. Understanding the struggle that teachers face daily in the classroom is important, so we can see the classroom through their eyes and become partners in educating our kids. The shift to student-directed, personalized learning requires significant effort and change on the part of teachers, schools, and families."

In the traditional education model, there was a sharp emphasis on "fixing" students so they could fit the outdated mold. UDL is a framework that ensures all students have options and choices about how they learn, how they share what they have learned and how they work through meaningful, authentic, valuable challenges.


UDL is endorsed as best practice in the Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA), which replaced No Child Left Behind in 2015. CAST, an educational organization based in Massachusetts, is the founder of UDL, first laying out the principles in the 1990s. Novak offers the analogy of UDL as a "buffet" of multiple options, as opposed to a "casserole."

- A "casserole" / "one-size-fits-all" lesson of traditional education: Students sat in rows, teachers assigned the same book to everyone, or delivered a lecture while students sat quietly and listened, and then they all took the same multiple-choice test, wrote an essay, or designed the occasional poster.
- A "buffet" lesson of UDL / personalized education: Instead of assigning the same text to the class, teachers focus on a theme, like tolerance, and students choose texts that have meaning to them. They could read a novel from the library, read an e-book on their iPad, listen to an audiobook or choose to read with peers or a teacher using short, meaningful texts. To share their knowledge, they can write essays or poetry; produce short movies or make book trailers; record podcasts; design infographics or suggest even more creative options.

Novak writes, "What is best for our kids is best for them in our homes and within their classroom walls. Both parents and teachers need to provide them with options so they can personalize their journey to achieve great things."
